- 1.Continue dialogue about online CSEA as an informal group (i.e Community of Practice/ Group of Experts/ Technical Working Group).
- 2. Map legislative frameworks in AMS for addressing CSEA crimes.
- 3. Map and connect law enforcement agencies and support services for CSEA cases in AMS.
- 4. Other ways to facilitate communication via the group.

Long-term: Explore possibility of a future regional mechanism for coordinating crossborder CSEA cases.



International Collaboration - ICSE



SPF's involvement in a success story (#1) – arrest of an offender in China

- On 7 April 2021, SPF received a notification from Interpol to look at a ICSE series involving a victim in a school uniform.
- On the same day, we looked into the series. Through the audio, we were able to narrow down the possible countries the suspect could be from.
- SPF conducted OSINT with school uniform logo and eventually found the school the victim was from.
- SPF, with the information and intelligence gathered, shared the information to Interpol through ICSE.
- On 2 May 2021, we were informed that China arrested a male, 21 years old, in the same province where the school was located.
- International collaboration allowed us to save the victim and prevent the suspect from committing more sexual crimes ridential / Non-Sensitive

International Collaboration - ICSE



SPF's involvement in a success story (#2) – arrest of an offender in China

- SPF was alerted to a child sexual assaulter who spoke in Mandarin and English in Mar 2022.
- SPF, together with officers from other countries, conducted covert ops with the aim of establishing his identity and location.
- Due to language compatibility, the SPF officer built rapport with the offender and learnt of his nationality, and that the two girls featured in the CSAM were his daughters. The abuse worsened with time.
- In late 2022, colleagues from Australia noticed the GPS info on 5 CSAM shared by the offender. The materials were recorded in China.
- SPF linked up with the city Police in China, and shared information with them. The offender was arrested in Feb 2023.
- International collaboration allowed us to save 2 young girls from their abusive father.

Successful International Collaboration

Successful collaboration #3

- SPF was alerted by Google to a subject who stores CSAM in his Google drive. SPF's probes into the subject's Google registration information, i.e. email/phone numbers, revealed that the subject is Malaysian, and enters Singapore daily to work.
- SPF went through the materials stored in the Google drive and confirmed that an offence of rape was committed on a girl, and the incident locations are likely not in Singapore.
- Within one week, we linked up with Royal Malaysian Police ('RMP') to hand over the materials and brief them on our analysis.
- RMP arrested the offender within a week and charged him for rape.
- International collaboration allowed us to save a young girl, who was the accused's niece, from repeated sexual abuse.
